
We believe in actively combatting classist and racist systems, championing models that empower communities, and amplifying the voices of young people as decision-makers in the future of our greater society.



Where We Come From

New Deal for Youth (ND4Y) changemakers are a cohort of **50 young leaders** between the **ages of 15 and 32** from across the country. These young leaders are advocates and organizers who work across a range of issues facing their communities.

# ND4Y Approach & Values

ND4Y was built from and for youth who have been historically marginalized, ignored, and silenced. ND4Y exists to show that young people do care and should be heard and centered during the policy-making process.

The ND4Y initiative was created through years of advocacy on the CLASP Youth Policy team to embark on an intentional process to partner with youth. CLASP's Youth Policy team embarked on a Young Adult Engagement Strategy (Y.A.E.S.) as a response to move from co-consulting with youth to partnering with youth directly. We believe that is imperative that advocates and policymakers place the lived experiences of youth and young adults front and center to any policy agenda that affects them.

At a time of pandemic, recession, public lynchings, and uprisings for racial justice, our nation is at a crossroads. The mounting stress and economic fallout from COVID-19 and racial turmoil is widening the equity gap for young people and communities of color. Young people are leading in the face of these entrenched challenges and demanding to be seen and heard. We are in a crisis and need action and investment from the public and private sector to support solutions proposed for decades by young people and racial justice leaders.

We can't wait for economic justice. We can't wait for healing and wellbeing. We can't wait for safe communities. It is time for a New Deal for Youth that responds to the historic roots and current scale of the crisis. When the once-in-a-lifetime catastrophe is over, our future as a nation will depend on how intentionally we invest in this generation.



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# Youth Participatory Action Research

When setting out to choose an evaluation strategy, the CLASP ND4Y Team chose to engage in the YPAR process to allow Changemakers to immerse themselves in the research process itself. Oftentimes, youth initiatives are measured by adult-driven outcomes. By engaging in YPAR, Changemakers were able to codesign the research question, process, and data analysis.



- 1. Oriented to the liberation and power of communities engaged in research and challenges paradigms that prioritize the expert researcher instead of communities impacted by social inequities and injustice.
- **2. Centering local knowledge**, concerns, lived experiences, and the voices of community.



# Changemaker Evaluation Team (YPAR Process)

The ND4Y Evaluation Strategy group consisted of **11 Changemakers** who participated in **over 30 virtual YPAR sessions** (2022-2023). The two-hour sessions were facilitated by the Praxis Institute and coordinated in the evenings accommodate Changemakers schedules across the country. As part of the YPAR process Changemakers were provided 1:1 coaching and follow-up between YPAR sessions.

#### The YPAR process engaged Changemakers in three types of modules that were aligned with the goals of ND4Y:

- 1. Understanding & Magnifying Self: Gaining insight into one's thoughts, emotions, beliefs, and values. Magnifying oneself involves leveraging this self-awareness to maximize one's strengths, address weaknesses, and pursue personal growth and fulfillment.
- 2. Understanding & Magnifying Others: As researchers developing empathy, active listening skills, and an appreciation for their unique perspectives and experiences of others.
- 3. Understanding & Magnifying Life: Examining the ways in which systemic oppression and inequality impact individuals and communities. Magnifying life involves actively promoting liberatory & progressive policies and taking action to dismantle oppressive structures and systems.



## **Changemaker YPAR Key Activities**

The Youth Participatory Action Research process engaged the evaluation team in YPAR sessions to investigate, analyze, and present ND4Y core activities and share outcomes with partners and CLASP staff.

- Designed a Continuous Quality Improvement Process (CQIP) for ND4Y
- Led a Community Assessment of their Local Areas
- Designed Surveys and Interview Protocols
- Developed a 2022 Report Documenting Key Accomplishments and Recommendations
- Documented ND4Y Atlanta and D.C Changemaker Events
- Analyzed Nearly 160 Hours of Interviews from Changemakers (N = 45)

## **Changemaker Experience**

The ND4Y Evaluation Strategy group, in collaboration with ND4Y staff, developed interview protocols and analyzed interview data from all Changemakers. In Spring 2022, they developed a short survey and coordinated data collection of the Changemaker experience in ND4Y.

Information collected provided actionable data to better understand the Changemakers experience and to inform program planning and capacity building opportunities. Interviews and survey questions were divided into 4 sections:

- 1) Knowledge & Skills
- 2) Overall Experience
- 3) Connectedness
- 4) Social Action Impact



### **YPAR: Common Themes**

Led by Changemakers Elias Khoury and Marissa Howdershelt, the evaluation group conducted several interviews with changemakers.

Common themes included:

- 1. Commitment: Changemakers commitment to pursue grassroots political work as a lifelong endeavor.
- **Lived Experience:** Changemakers have come to do this work because of their own personal experience.
- Youth-Doing it Differently: Changemakers emphasized the importance of blazing their own trail. While past activists provide inspiration and learnings, Changemakers believe it's important to cultivate their own style of leadership and activism.
- 4. **Youth Leadership:** There is collective agreement, when asked *what sets ND4Y apart?*, Changemakers stated that ND4Y is authentically youth-led.

Being a black girl is hard. Society really tries to push us out. When I realized that, it seemed obvious this problem required legislative solutions. We need to pass bills and transform the legal landscape to empower marginalized communities.

My alma mater, lacked a quality infrastructure for mental health despite its progressive reputation. Administrators dismissed young people's perspectives and did not see them as experts on their own experiences. We felt that our concerns regarding mental health fell on deaf ears. So, I sought to validate young people's experience and advocate for youth mental health.



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## **Overall Experience**

**Key Takeaways:** Changemakers felt their experience provided them with the opportunity to explore their own interests and were highly engaged. Many Changemakers appreciated being **challenged to try new things** as well as building new relationships and friendships.

#### What Changemakers Had to Say...

The most important thing I learned as a Changemaker is to take in all the stories from other Changemakers because this experience gave me an opportunity to look at life from several different lenses and grow from that."

#### Connectedness

**Key Takeaways:** ND4Y started working with Changemakers in 2021 at the height of COVID. By 2022 zoom fatigue had set in and people were excited to see each other in person. **As a result of feedback** ND4Y hosted two weeklong in-person events in 2022 and began providing spaces for Changemakers in the same region to connect more frequently.

#### What Changemakers Had to Say...

I love y'all, but these Zoom meetings... I want to connect with you all in real life.

As COVID is becoming more manageable and many cases aren't fatal, maybe some more in-person events. Maybe small tri-state area events so the people attending are relatively close to the destination or offer one trip a year for the all changemakers.

## **Social Action Impact**

**Key Takeaways**: ND4Y Changemakers participated in over **40 meetings with congressional offices,** reviewed and scored over **80 pieces of legislation,** and elevated the ND4Y story at over **50 different events** across the country. Changemakers reported a high level of growth attributed to:

- Taking action to solve issues facing their community
- Organizing with peers around social issues
- Analyzing policy
- Creating policy that benefits their community
- Interacting with Lawmakers

## **Knowledge and Skills Impact**

Key Takeaways: Changemakers reported gaining and strengthening a variety of skills, engaging in new experiences and feeling proud of their work as well as more confident as a result of participation. The top skills Changemakers reported include: 1) Gaining 21st Century Skills 2) Using the Arts to Advance Change; 3) Facilitation and Leading a meeting; 4) Policy analysis.

### What Changemakers Had to Say...

I have learned a lot about the importance of intersectionality when thinking of policy solutions as well as a better understanding of how advocacy differs across the different branches of government.

I have learned how necessary it is to have and to hear the voices from every walk of life possible as well as how much work goes into forming, analyzing, and pushing demands, as well as catering demands to the policymaker we want to influence.







# Participatory Democracy in Action

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## **Participatory Democracy in Action**

- In November 2020 CLASP launched the New Deal for Youth (ND4Y) ND4Y Youth Data Portraits set the context, urgency and action steps (#WhyWeCantWait).
- Decisions were guided by <u>Hartnett's Consensus-Oriented Decision-Making Model</u> and the <u>Modified Borda Count Method</u>.

It was very collaborative in the sense that youth had agency to arrive at their own issue areas and go deeper than just the surface level, but addressing root causes such as racism, social determinants of health and socioeconomic status. – Year 1 Changemaker

[The discussions] gave me a lot of opportunities to tell my story and think about experiences as a black woman in society. It was centered in our lived experience and things we are passionate about. For me, the process showcased true democracy and civic engagement. – Year 1 Changemaker



## **Economic Justice & Opportunity**

True economic justice and opportunity are not luxuries, but fundamental rights that every individual deserves. We must challenge the systems that perpetuate inequality, and fight for a future where everyone has equal access to resources, education, and the chance to thrive.



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We demand funding in youth development, education, workforce, and job training programs for middle and high school age youth and young adults, where young people can learn "soft" skills and have paid internships, apprenticeships, and job opportunities especially in the green economy and STEM sector.

We demand an overhaul in democratic infrastructure that is designed around the needs of each local community and prioritizes accessibility and ease in voting. For example: increase polling places proportionate to the local population, national same-day registration at voting sites, provide voteby-mail as an option, ensure voting cards and mail-in ballots can be accessed in multiple languages, extend early voting periods, and restore voting rights for all citizens.

## Legislative Scorecard Criteria:

ND4Y reviews policy on an ongoing basis to ensure that legislation benefits youth and their families across the country. Below are questions asked by Changemakers when scoring legislation. More information about how the Scorecard Criteria was used can be found in our <u>Legislative Agenda</u>.

#### Tier 1

- Does it shift power, decisionmaking, and/or resources to youth and young adults?
- Is it youth-led?
- Does it dismantle institutions and systems that have become complacent?
- Is it youth-centered?
- Does it address immediate needs?
- Does it build momentum towards systems change?

#### Tier 2

- Does it transform the system rather than reform it?
- Does it support young people's liberation?
- Does it set youth up for success?
- Does it center healing?
- Is it community-driven?
- Does it address many different areas that impact young people's lives?

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#### Tier 3

- Does it address long-term thriving?
- Does it ensure that none of our priority populations are left out?

  Does it shift narratives around youth and young adults?
- Does it recognize that young people hold more than one identity at the same time?
- Does it recognize that we all deserve great things for our communities?
- Does it benefit at least one priority population?

Over the course of 3 days, Changemakers...


- Presented policy priorities to lawmakers with 29 legislative meetings



## Strategy Groups Year 2: An Overview

In 2021 (Year 1), ND4Y virtually convened during the pandemic to brainstorm what were the most pressing issues that mattered the most to Changemakers. In 2022 (Year 2), ND4Y transitioned from taking those demands and focusing on how to make those demands into reality. This led to ND4Y to create the following five action-focused strategy groups. All Strategy Groups have three co leads: 1) ND4Y Staff member, 2) Changemaker, and 3) Partner

## Leadership Structure

In its second year, ND4Y added a steering committee made up of Changemaker and Partner co-leads from each strategy group. The group met monthly to share crossproject updates, brainstorm ideas, plan quarterly full group meetings, and provide feedback. This structure was developed to ensure that the voices of the leadership team truly influenced the work done in between meetings, and to increase Changemaker and partner ownership of the project.







## **Lessons Learned**

In 2022, Praxis conducted 14 interviews with CLASP staff documenting the process and overall implementation of ND4Y. The lessons learned include:

- Adaptability: It is critical to be flexible when implementing strategies. The pandemic forced ND4Y to consistently reassess and modify in order to meet the evolving needs of Changemakers.
- Non-linear Process: Achieving legislative success is messy and unpredictable. It requires navigating complex power dynamics, facing resistance from entrenched interests, and making strategic compromises. While frustrating at times, Changemakers learned the need for persistence, long term strategy, and grassroots organizing to bring about the systemic change their communities deserve.
- Better Together: While digital tools work, you can't replace the power of face-to-face planning and networking. In-person opportunities foster deeper connection, relationships, empathy, and collaboration. Post pandemic, ND4Y was reminded of what can be achieved when you engage Changemakers in community building and social change efforts.
- Collaboration is Key: Working with partners, organizations, community leaders, and Changemakers is key to amplifying the ND4Y impact and reaching a broader audience. 'Together, we can achieve far more than working in isolation.'

## **Lessons Learned**

- Building Trust is a Process: Building trust takes time and intentionality. ND4Y staff learned that authenticity, transparency, and active listening are crucial in establishing trust and cultivating long-term relationships. It takes meeting Changemakers and partners where they are and understanding the diverse needs and interests of everyone involved. This type of support allowed for trust to be nurtured between Changemakers in order to foster engagement and meaningful participation.
- Radical Joy: 'We can't thrive without it.' ND4Y continues to focus on Changemakers having the opportunity to reclaim their happiness, celebrate their identities, and envision a world filled with liberation, justice, and collective well-being.
- Continuous Evaluation and Learning: Regularly evaluating the programs and learning from both successes and failures is essential for growth. ND4Y is committed to refining strategies, improving impact, and adapting to the ever-changing lives of Changemakers.
- Self-Care is Non-Negotiable: The work can be emotionally and mentally demanding. ND4Y realized the importance of prioritizing self-care for staff and providing spaces for well-being.

#### **Strategic Positioning:**

- Changemakers are seen as experts in policy solutions and are sought out as collaborators in policy making through partnerships with lawmakers and the administration.
- Strengthen the political and organizing power of young people so that more young people are seen, heard, and validated.




#### **State and Local Activations**
