A LETTER FROM A NEW DEAL FOR YOUTH CHANGEMAKER



A New Deal for Youth is an iterative experiment in youth-led work. This experiment has proven definitively the power of young people when in positions of leadership. We spent our first few years together planting the seeds for youth-led work. Changemakers had already been doing powerful work in their communities; we only needed to ground ourselves in federal policy and grow our roots. We received training, evaluated legislation, connected with local and federal youth-led and youth-serving organizations, and met with members of Congress and agency officials.

In 2023, A New Deal for Youth began to blossom. We stepped into our power as experts and authorities. Changemakers from around the country came together in the summer for our Hill Briefing, "How to Put Youth in Power: Youth-Led Legislation." A panel of young people educated legislators and staffers on how to engage youth stakeholders with dignity and benefit from our expertise. We stood on the steps of the Supreme Court with Rep. Ocasio-Cortez as she spoke about the importance of student loan debt forgiveness. At a Press Briefing that day, Representatives Jamaal Bowman, Chuy

Garcia, Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, and Summer Lee stated their commitment to opening pathways for young people to introduce their own legislation.

Young people in A New Deal for Youth are working to realize that vision. At our Week of Action, we met with Rep. Morgan McGarvey, who sought our input on his Young Adult Tax Credit Act (YATCA). We advocated for legislation that supports young people and led important conversations with leaders at the Office of the Surgeon General, Housing and Urban Development, and the U.S. Department of Labor. At our Grassroots Festival, we uplifted the importance of art in advocacy and opened up the space for powerful musical and spoken word performances. The Administrative and Legislative Advocacy Groups teamed up with GoodKids Mad-City to teach young people at D.C. public schools about public policy advocacy.

We are working to not only evaluate and advocate for legislation, but also introduce our own. We are working to form a nationwide network of youth organizations to share resources, organize, and build youth power. At every step, we have sought to ground our work in community and share forward the knowledge and resources we have received.

We are working to ensure that youth-led work is more than just a concept. Youth-led work is our reality. Our Changemakers were involved in the planning and execution of the 2024 White House Youth Summit, and will be leading the charge to implement young people's recommendations from the summit. We are finally beginning to realize the fruits of our collective labor, and you'd better believe we're going to replant those seeds. We're just getting started.



Hill Briefing

In June, Changemakers called on federal legislators to prioritize youth-led policymaking at a Capitol Hill briefing in coordination with Representative Jamaal Bowman (D-NY)'s office. Representatives Chuy Garcia (D-IL) and Summer Lee (D-PA), along with advocacy organizations Gen-Z For Change and Sunrise Movement joined ND4Y Changemakers and staff for the briefing and subsequent press conference. To everyone's surprise and excitement, Representative Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-NY) dropped by for a visit right at the end!

Changemakers organized a panel, "How to Put Youth in Power: A Hill Office's Guide to Youth Legislation," which stressed the importance of putting young people at the helm of developing legislation rather than just treating youth as subjects. Representatives Bowman, Lee, and Ocasio-Cortez all pledged their support for a youth-led legislative process, Ocasio-Cortez

attended the press conference on her way to the Supreme Court to advocate for student loan cancellation, and she connected the fight for student loan cancellation to youth-led policy.

Week of Action

The second annual New Deal for Youth Week of Action took place in November and was a big success! Changemakers joined forces in D.C. and engaged with policymakers, shared the importance of our demands, and built community with each other and with our partners.

Each day during the Week of Action was guided by one of New Deal for Youth's project or strategy groups. At the Grassroots Festival, led by the **Grassroots Team**, Changemakers shared their stories during a cultural exchange and participated in a panel discussion that connected art and activism. The event also featured interactive art and awesome musical performances, including by our very own Aaron Mack and Andre Simms. We also honored some amazing organizations working with youth in the D.C. area and listened to awesome musical performances, some by Changemakers!

Changemakers toured the Capitol while the **Administrative Advocacy Team** met with officials from the Biden administration to advocate for youth-led policy. The Admin Team also led Changemakers in a teach-in on power mapping in partnership with Chicago-based community organization GoodKids MadCity.

And finally, the **Legislative Advocacy Group** led us through Hill Day, where Changemakers split into teams to visit members of Congress to advocate for the Young Adult Tax Credit Act, the Green New Deal for Schools Act, and the Connecting Youth to Jobs Act for a powerful day of activism and advocacy on Capitol Hill. All three bills that Changemakers advocated for during Hill Day connect directly to the Economic Justice and Opportunity and Environmental Justice pillars of A New Deal for Youth's policy platform.

During Hill Day, Changemakers met with Representative Morgan McGarvey (D-KY) in support of the Young Adult Tax Credit Act, which would ensure young people ages 18-24 have access to much-needed resources during critical years of their lives. As a direct result of Changemakers' advocacy, Rep. Bonnie Watson Coleman (D-NJ) co-sponsored the introduction of the Young Adult Tax Credit!


